



KAUPAPA REORUA FUND

FUND GUIDELINES Quarterly Funding Value: \$2000.00

On 11 August 2017, Te Tatau o Te Arawa, with support from its partner, the Rotorua Lakes Council and Te Puni Kōkiri, launched Rotorua Reorua as the first bilingual city in Aotearoa. A city in which we support and promote both te reo Māori and English language.

Rotorua Reorua goals are to: *normalise te reo Māori and have it seen, heard and celebrated alongside te reo Pākehā in different spaces and places in our city (and district).*

As well as helping to meet Rotorua Reorua goals, the Kaupapa Reorua fund aims to meet Te Arawa 2050 Vision aspirations, in particular the Te Arawatanga whāinga that: *our future has Te Arawa reo, tikanga and values woven into the everyday of our people, our partners and the communities in our rohe.*

Total quarterly value: \$2,000.00

As a lead of a tuakana reorua city, Te Tatau has been supported with funds from the Department of Internal Affairs' new Aotearoa Reorua programme for reorua towns and cities.

We now have \$20k available for the next two years (i.e. \$10,000 per year) to support hapū, iwi and community led kaupapa reorua (bilingual events and activities).

We are making \$2,000 available for applications every quarter for the next two years (with a further \$2,000 set aside each year for discretionary reorua projects).

Applying for funding

- Applicants and their kaupapa must reside in the Rotorua District.
- Funds are currently available from the kaupapa reorua fund for not-for-profit purposes and projects, which support the above Rotorua Reorua goals and meet the above Te Arawatanga whāinga from the Te Arawa Vision.
- Priority will be given to those kaupapa that a wide range of people will be able to participate in.
- We accept applications in Te Reo Māori and English

What we don't fund

We will not consider funding from the Reorua fund for:

- Project that is being conducted or held outside of the Rotorua District
- Groups operating outside of the Rotorua District
- Overseas travel
- Funds for the creation of loads, scholarships, gifts etc
- No retrospective applications will be considered
- Capital items in general. The exception would be bilingual signage that can be reused in the future.

Value of funds available

A total of \$2000.00 is available per quarter for the next two years to be distributed to the Rotorua District Community.

Other important information

- Funds must be used for the purpose of which they were granted.
- Successful applications will be selected by the funding committee. The decision will be final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Successful applicant/s must acknowledge Rotorua Reorua in their promotional activities

Funds may only be spent as approved in your application. Once completed you will be required to provide us with a report on your kaupapa.

This report must include

1. Number of attendees
2. How your event/project met the Rotorua Reorua goals and the Te Arawatanga whāinga
3. Copies of receipts
4. Photographs of the event/project should be provided wherever possible.
5. We accept reports in Te Reo Māori and English

This report to be provided within two (2) months of the event or project being held.
